Apply to the **Bilateral and Multilateral Exchange Programs** for Summer or Fall 2011

Below is the list of bilateral exchange programs. Read on as we are introducing multilateral exchange programs at many different institutions. Please note that there is an application fee for certain programs.

While degree programs vary from one institution to another, we have noted the AUI programs in which some similar classes are offered at the host institution. UCC means that there are a wide range of classes that will meet AUI's University Core Curriculum requirements.

If you insist on taking specific classes, then you may be disappointed. Your application can be approved long before you know which courses will be offered. Students who have 30 to 60 credits now face a far better chance of finding a number of many classes that fit their degree program. Students with 75 credits or more face limitations and fewer choices. Students with over 90 credits may not apply as too many end up cancelling. If you have over 90 credits bring a copy of your degree plan and make an appointment with Mrs. Fishburn for permission to proceed with an application.

Also, be aware that a few institutions require a paper based TOEFL score of 550 or IBT of 80 taken within the last two years.

Summer

Students usually take 2 classes for a total of 6 credits. There are usually few upper division classes offered in summer but many classes that can be taken an elective or core curriculum.

MULTILATERAL EXCHANGE PROGRAMS

How are these different from the bilateral exchange programs?

The bilateral programs are between two institutions only. AUI has joined ISEP (www.isep.org) and we exchange students but can do so with different institutions and ISEP keeps the balances: 5 go out and 5 come in, but different institutions are involved.

AUI students pay tuition, housing, meal plan and some other fee as usual to AUI and pay deposit, insurance and other fees when they arrive at the host institution.

Selection means you are competing with students from outside of AUI but we have included institutions where there is a very high chance to be placed. We should be able to place at least 6 to 8 students from AUI.

Students have to have a CGPA of 3.00 and are required to pay an application fee. Most of the fee will be refunded if the student is not placed, however, for Fall 2011, we received a list where students have a very high chance to be placed.

Students who choose ISEP schools from the list below that have an excellent chance of placement even though they are coming in past the deadline (a complete list can be found here: http://www.isep.org/students/Intl_Students/anticipated_openings_in_the_usa.asp).

Even so, these students must be flexible in their choices and should list at least 3 if not more schools on their host site request list (the ones with asterisks are the best chances of placement):

Selection may be very competitive for specific institutions and programs. Please visit the website www.aui.ma/international to find information and links to partner universities and colleges.

To be a good candidate for International Exchange the applicant must:

- 1- Have completed at least academic 4 semesters or 45 credit hours (including the current semester) and no more than 95;
- 2- Have a cumulative GPA of at least 3.00 (If your GPA is less than 3.00, see the OIP to discuss options which are limited.)
3. Students who have applied to exchange programs before and declined can apply on a space available basis after all other first time candidates have been placed.
4. Students who have participated before in an exchange program or other study abroad program can apply on a space available basis after all other first and second time applicants have been placed.
- 5- Be mature and confident (These demonstrated in the faculty references and the quality of the essay. Planning with the advice of the advisor will also be checked.)
- 6- Be committed to being an Ambassador for both AUI and Morocco, which means being available to talk to students and other interested parties as directed by the host school.
- 7- Return to AUI to bring the knowledge and experience gained to assist in the development of student and academic life.
